1. These conditions govern my use of all ICLE Online Resources—the ICLE Partnership Resources, Online Books, Online Training, Online Certificate Programs, On-Demand Seminars, MP3 Downloads, and MI Law Online.
2. The ICLE Online Resources are copyrighted publications. All rights belong to ICLE or its third-party contributors.
3. I may use the ICLE Online Resources only for my own law practice or legal research. While I have an active subscription, I may
 - Access, search, retrieve and view the ICLE Online Resources in the normal course of my law practice or legal research;
 - Download and adapt selected forms and jury instructions that I am using for client matters or court proceedings;
 - Quote and excerpt from other ICLE Online Resources (with appropriate credit) by electronic or other means in the documents I create for my law practice or legal research;
 - Print out reasonable portions for internal use;
 - Print out a copy of the seminar materials for seminars I am attending or viewing; and
 - Download MP3 files of seminars.
4. **Other than these permitted uses, I may not share, copy, give away, display, reuse or resell the material in the ICLE Online Resources.** For example, I may not--
 - Download, copy, or electronically transmit significant portions of these materials
 - Download significant portions to use after my subscription expires
 - Obtain material for others
 - Copy any portion of ICLE Online Resources into artificial intelligence tools (e.g., ChatGPT)

Examples of permitted uses: You copy 30 pages of an online book to help with research on a brief, or you've used 50 forms from the Formbank during your Partnership year, and your edited forms are stored on your computer. You do legal research in MI Law Online, and download 10 cases for use in writing a brief. These uses are typical for an active user in the normal course of law practice or legal research and are done in the course of your law practice.

Examples of uses that are not permitted: You copy a book chapter or a How-To Kit and email it to a lawyer outside your firm, post it in a listserv or on the Internet; you input a form into an artificial intelligence tool and ask it to customize it to your facts; you save 100 forms or multiple chapters from an online book to keep after your subscription expires; or you invite others to view an On-Demand Seminar you have registered for.

5. I understand that ICLE will determine what is reasonable use and significant portions in its sole discretion. I also understand that ICLE provides the Online Resources on an "as is" "as available" basis, and expressly disclaims all warranties. These services and information do not constitute legal advice, and their use is not a substitute for my own independent professional judgment.
