Not Already VA Accredited?

Lawyers must be accredited by the Department of Veterans Affairs to assist with VA benefit claims. If you are not already accredited, submit Form 21a: www.va.gov/ogc/accreditation.asp.

Prior to this seminar, if you receive notification from the VA that you are accredited, then you can count this event toward your required three-hour VA CLEs. Please note that it can take 60 to 120 days to receive that notification.
